

## Chapter 57

### GOVERNMENT AND ELECTIONS

#### **§ 57-1. Village government.**

The Village of Hustisford is a body corporate and politic with the powers of a municipality at common law and governed by the provisions of Chs. 61 and 66, Wis. Stats., laws amending those chapters, other acts of the legislature and the Constitution of the State of Wisconsin.

#### **§ 57-2. Election poll hours.** <sup>1</sup>

The voting polls in the Village of Hustisford, Dodge County, Wisconsin, shall be open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. for all elections.

#### **§ 57-3. Official newspaper.**

The official Village newspaper shall be the Watertown Daily Times, to be used for the publication of legal and/or official notices and documents when publication is used instead of posting as allowed by Wisconsin law.

#### **§ 57-4. Election officials.**

Pursuant to the Wisconsin Statutes, there is hereby established one set of election officials to conduct all elections in the two wards of the Village which shall consist of seven election inspectors. However, the Village Clerk-Treasurer shall have the power to limit the number of election officials. The Clerk-Treasurer shall determine in advance of each election whether the number of election officials for such election should be reduced from the number prescribed by the Wisconsin Statutes, and if such a reduction is so determined, the Clerk-Treasurer shall further redistribute duties among the remaining officials.

#### **§ 57-5. Nomination of candidates by nonpartisan primary.**

A. The caucus to nominate candidates for elective office in the Village of Hustisford

under § 8.05(1), Wis. Stats., is dispensed with. Candidates for elective office of the Village of Hustisford shall be nominated by a nonpartisan primary under § 8.05(4) and (5), Wis. Stats.

- B. Nomination papers for this purpose shall be supplied by the Village Clerk-Treasurer and shall be signed by not fewer than 20 nor more than 100 electors of the Village. The papers shall be circulated pursuant to state law. Notice shall be given under §§ 10.01(2)(a) and 10.06(2)(a), Wis. Stats.
- C. No additional candidates may be nominated under § 8.05(1), Wis. Stats.
- D. A primary election shall be held only when the number of candidates for an elective office in the municipality exceeds twice the number to be elected to the office. Those offices for which a primary has been held shall have only the names of candidates nominated at the primary appear on the official spring election ballot. When the number of candidates for an office does not exceed twice the number to be elected, their names shall be printed on the official ballot for the regular election without a primary.
