

Police and License Committee of the Village of Hustisford

Meeting Minutes

August 31, 2015

Opening:

The regular meeting of the Police and License Committee of the Village of Hustisford was called to order at 5:00 p.m. on August 31, 2015 in the Hustisford Village Hall by Village Trustee Ted Engelbart

Present:

Police Chief Dan Link, Dennis Uecker, Ted Engelbart, Mary Jensen and Mike Grant.

Public Appearances: Kelly L. Murphy appeared to request an approval of her operator's license. Chief Link had indicated that Kelly had two previous violations for OAI. One violation was about 15 years ago and the 2nd violation occurred about 5 years ago. Chief Link had indicated that the state advises against issuing an operator's license when there are two or more OAI violations; however Chief Link further stated that he couldn't find a time line for the occurrences of these offenses written in the states recommendations.

Chief Link stated that due to the fact that one violation was 15 years ago, he would recommend approval of Kelly's license.

Chief Link had also recommended the approval of an operator's license for Janet M. Thom. Mary Jensen had made a motion to present these recommendations to the full board for approval; it was 2nd by Ted Engelbart and passed unanimously.

Mary Jensen had also requested to have Chief Link research the prohibitions set up by the state relative to the procurement of an operator's licenses to see if the village could dictate its own criteria.

Approval of Minutes from the July 27, 2015 meeting:

A motion was made to approve the minutes by Dennis Uecker and second by Mike Grant. The motion carried unanimously.

Chief Link briefed the Committee on the Departments 2015 Goals & Objectives

Relative to community service the Chief stated that the National Night Out was a big success. There were 67 youth names submitted for the bike drawing and 52 youths participated in the bicycle riding skills course.

Officers Weber and Roeber represented the Police Department at the Community Fair held at the high school. The officers provided bicycle locks, gun locks and community watch packets to the attendees. Chief Link also appeared at the fair in a civilian capacity and conducted free martial arts demonstrations for the public.

The police department continues to wait for the Dodge County Sheriff's Department to choose their computer software as there were just too many issues with the New World software. This has been and continues to be an ongoing project for the Sheriff's department.

The TRACs program is now 100% operational. Officers are issuing citations and are continuing with their education of the system.

The SMART "Suburban Mutual Response Team" committee is scheduled to meet September 8, 2015. The goal is to have the initial program ready for the DCELRA meeting approval in October 2015.

Kim Koronka was also requesting approval of street use for the Annual Harvest Festival scheduled for Saturday, October 10th and for Founder John's Day scheduled for Saturday, September 12th. Upon Chief Link recommending approval of these permits a motion was made by Mary Jensen to approve with a waiver of the fees with Ted Engelbart providing the 2nd and it was voted unanimously.
