§ 277-4B(3) Sidewalk proximity to the address side of property.

- (a) Backyard sidewalks. When backyard sidewalks are required, the entire cost of installation, repair and maintenance shall be borne by the Village.
- (b) Long side sidewalks. Sidewalks that are located on side yards of property. When long side sidewalks are required, the entire cost of installation, repair, and maintenance shall be borne by the property owner.

§ 277-4E(1)

E. Repair or replacement of defective sidewalks.

(1) The Village Board or Public works representatives may determine that any sidewalk which is unsafe, defective, or insufficient be repaired or removed and replaced with a sidewalk in accordance with this section. Defects may include spalling, cracks, chipped area, or damage caused by tree roots, any quality of the concrete that has become a safety issue. The existence of any one or more of the hereinafter enumerated characteristics shall determine whether a sidewalk is defective or insufficient:

- (a) A five-eighths inch or more vertical differential rise between adjacent sharp-edged individual sidewalk blocks (crack in slab) and between adjacent round-edged individual sidewalk blocks (joint).
- (b) A one-half-inch opening between adjacent individual sidewalk blocks.
- (c) Deterioration of spalled or chipped sidewalk that is chipped where-as to create a trip hazard on the surface with a vertical depth of one-half-inch or more.

(2) If 80% of a property owner's sidewalk blocks are determined to be defective or insufficient, the entire sidewalk shall be replaced.
